1. Is there anything not covered by the proposed indicators? (if yes, please explain)
No, the indicators cover everything the committee would expect.
2. Are there any indicators that you feel are not appropriate and, if so, why?
No, the indicators are appropriate and proportionate.
3. Is there any information we ask for that you feel does not need to be included or
that we have been missed?
The indicators are comprehensive and in the main we feel these are appropriate. As tenant representatives we are aware of challenges around mixed tenure blocks and getting buy-in and
agreement from owner occupiers and private landlords. It would be helpful for EESSH data
returns to capture information on this specific issue to allow some consideration of the scale of
issues relating to mixed tenure.
4: Would you like to make any other comments or suggestions about our proposed
Indicators?
As tenant representatives we are very aware of the impact of fuel poverty on some households. We hope EESSH 2 will continue to improve energy performance outcomes for tenants and that
this will contribute to a decline in fuel poverty. It would be useful to see some explicit linkage of
the impact of EESSH on fuel poverty going forward.
We note that EESSH2 will not be incorporated in the Scottish Social Housing Charter until the
next review in 2022 and that the first year's return on EESSH2 will be a form issued to landlords
for completion. It would be helpful to know if the returns for this year will be published by SHR
even though they will not form part of the Charter reporting framework until the following year.
